- **Exhibit on AUB Student Magazines: 1898-1946**

The AUB Archives and Special Collections will be exhibiting over 70 student publications, dating back to as early as 1898. These magazines, edited by students of different nationalities, many of which are handwritten, come in several languages: Arabic, English, and French. They vary in length of running, subjects, layout and design, and significance, but in all cases, they constitute a real treasure trove for sources on student life at the Syrian-Protestant College, and later AUB, and provide a glimpse of a self-narrative of the students' individual and group concerns, interests, ambitions, and out-looks. In the plethora of backgrounds, opinions, formats, political affiliation, design, etc. they are a true testimony to the liberal arts education AUB has offered to its students since 1866.

The exhibition will run from 8am to 5pm until October 31, 2013, in Jafet Library.
